

Camp Policies & Guidelines Campers

1. Insurance

Make sure all insurance information on Registration Form is filled in completely.

2. Leaving Campgrounds

Youth and children are not allowed to leave the campgrounds without permission from Camp leadership under any circumstances.

3. Registration Guidelines

All registrations are made on a first-come, first served basis. Cancellations are non-refundable although transferable within the church.

Late Registration Policy: Your registration must be received by the date indicated on the registration form. A \$25.00 late registration fee will be added to the balance due for late registration. Room assignments with your group are NOT guaranteed if your registration is late.

Part-time campers: If you would like to attend Camp on a part-time basis, the following applies:

1. There is a **\$70 a night/person charge**, which includes lodging and meals. This only applies for 2 nights or less. Anything over 2 nights will be charged the full Camp fee.
2. Please call the Camp office before coming to Camp for room availability.
3. All part-time campers must complete Registration Form and register their car with Camp office.
4. All part-time campers must check-in and -out with Camp office. The room should be cleaned and will be inspected before campers depart campgrounds.
5. All part-time campers will be expected to abide by all Camp policies and guidelines, including receiving and wearing the camper identification wristband.

4. Camper Guidelines

- a. All campers (including part-time campers) are expected to attend each class and service.
- b. NO CELL PHONES ALLOWED.
- c. NO ELECTRONIC GAMES ALLOWED.

Camper Dress Code: Above all, we expect campers to dress in a manner that could be described as moderate. Extremes in fashion will not be allowed for boys or girls. Any camper whose clothing, in the opinion of Camp leadership, violates the following rules will be asked to return to the dorm to change. Use the attitude, "when in doubt, don't." Please note that shorts are acceptable for all sessions and services.

The Camp **will not permit** the following clothing items:

- a. Extremely short shorts, miniskirts, or dresses.
- b. Backless tops, halters, spaghetti-strap shirts.
- c. Clothing with slogans or artwork not consistent with the purpose of Camp (i.e. beer ads, secular rock groups, tobacco ads, etc.).
- d. Bikini, string-type or questionable swimsuits.

Cabin/Dorm/Grounds Guidelines

- a. Every camper must be responsible for his/her own bedding, clothing, luggage, and personal belongings.
- b. Cabins are off limits during class sessions and services.
- c. A camper should never be alone in a cabin.
- d. Money and valuables should never be left unattended.
- e. Campers are required to stay in their cabins each night, from the announcement of "lights off" until the morning, except for special emergencies. No lights or noises are permitted in the cabins during sleeping hours.
- f. Campers may enter another cabin only by permission of the dorm leader of the cabin and only during dorm leader's presence. Boys are not permitted to enter the area of the girls' cabin and girls are not permitted to enter the area of the boys' cabin.
- g. Campers **MUST** check-in all medications to the camp nurse.
- h. All campers should stay within the designated boundaries of camp. Areas beyond boundaries are off limits.
- i. After evening services, campers are allowed in lighted areas around or near the Snack Shack, Tabernacle, and Dining Hall. All other areas are considered off limits after dark unless otherwise stated.
- j. The First Aid Station is off limits to all campers not requiring treatment by the Camp Nurse.
- k. All campers should give respect to the campgrounds, permanent building, and facilities. Any camper defacing Camp property or the natural surroundings must pay for damages incurred and may be dismissed from Camp. Please notify Camp leadership immediately of any disrespect shown to Camp grounds and facilities.

5. Safety Guidelines

- a. There is absolutely no smoking permitted at camp.
- b. There will be absolutely no fires of any sort started by campers.
- c. Do not tamper with fire alarms, fire extinguishers, or smoke detectors. This is a felony offense. If a fire occurs, report it to the Camp leadership or any Camp staff member immediately.
- d. Do not sit on or tamper with propane tanks.
- e. There will be no rock throwing, or any other activity that could cause harm to others.
- f. No glass of any kind (i.e. bottles, jars, or drinking glasses, etc.) are allowed on the grounds at any time.
- g. Shoes must be worn at all times outside the cabins to and from the swimming pool.
- h. If camper is feeling sick, he/she should report it to their Camp dorm leader.
- i. Camp Courtney is a drug-free, alcohol-free, weapon-free environment. Use or possession of drugs, drug paraphernalia, alcohol, or weapons shall be grounds for immediate dismissal.
- j. Wristbands must be worn at all times. \$1.00 cost for replacement wristbands.

6. Camp Check-Out

- a. All campers are expected to participate in Camp clean-up on the final day of Camp.
- b. The last day of Camp will begin at 6:00 a.m. with a wake-up call. Campers will pack their suitcases and move their gear out of the dorms before beginning their clean-up duties.
- c. From 7:00–8:00 a.m., each camper will participate in the cleaning of Camp, specifically their living area for the week. The area will be inspected by a member of the Camp leadership.
- d. When the clean-up assignments are complete and room has passed inspection, campers will be sent to dining hall for breakfast. Breakfast will be served from 7:30-8:30 a.m.
- e. All campers must pass clean-up inspections for their dorms or cabins before eating breakfast.
- f. Camp is officially over at 8:30 a.m. after a gathering in front of dining hall for an ending prayer.
